Safety From the Outside In

The Collingwood Business area offers a wide selection of businesses and services. While the Collingwood BIA area does not experience a lot of crime, sometimes crime does happen. Whether it be a break in, theft, fraud or robbery, there are steps that can be taken to help reduce the chances of being a victim of crime. In this article we will talk about securing your business beginning with the outside. In future articles, we will discuss what you can do to prevent crime in the interior of your business.

First impressions of a business begin as you approach the premise. Imagine walking up to a business that is poorly maintained, litter scattered about, poorly signed, no sign of activity inside...this appearance will deter customers and may attract criminals....The first line of defence in protecting your business begins with the outside. A well maintained exterior is one of the first steps in making your business attractive for customers, but it also helps prevent crime. Here are a few tips to help reduce crime;

- * Keep the exterior well maintained
- * Keep your windows clear of advertising to allow for clear sight lines...you can see out and people can see in
- * Keep the area out front and back clear of litter and garbage
- * Immediately report graffiti to the Collingwood BIA
- * Have your business clearly signed and ensure your address is clearly visible
- * Display a "No Cash On Site After Hours" sign
- * Don't leave anything around your business that could be used to break-in i.e. rocks, loose planters
- * Keep the back alley way clear of illegal dumping and garbage
- * Look at your whole property and assess for vulnerable access points including the roof top and loading bays
- * If you have parking in the rear, have signage reminding employees and customers to remove all valuables from their vehicles
- * Install good lighting
- * Install a surveillance camera
- * Get to now your business neighbours
- * Utilize the BIA Guardians
